## HOPE THROUGH THE WORD IN ETHIOPIA

I will ... transform the Valley of Trouble into a gateway of hope. — Hosea 2:15 (NLT)

Believers who speak the Eastern Oromo language in Ethiopia suffer persecution from those who adhere to the majority religion of the area. Churches struggle to find a place to meet, and Christians struggle to find good jobs. "So many churches were burned down," said a project coordinator. "But Christians remained steadfast and overcame the challenge through trust in God's providence."

Anti-Christian sentiment has run high this year, but the recent translation of the book of Nehemiah gave them hope and courage. "It has created great joy in the communities because the book contains messages that transform their lives," said the project coordinator.

In addition to persecution, many struggle with *khat*, a plant whose leaves are used as a potent drug. Seventy percent of the young people use *khat*. High rates of HIV and AIDS also plague the Eastern Oromo community. The people need to experience the transforming power of God's Word in their lives and communities.

Wycliffe Bible Translators is working in partnership with a local team to complete the Eastern Oromo Old Testament and prepare it for publication. The team has already completed translation of the New Testament and the book of Nehemiah. Now, as they complete the Old Testament, the team will also publish the book of Hosea in audio and print formats, as well as Genesis in audio form.

"We are currently challenged by political unrest," said a local pastor.

"We urgently need the book of Hosea that speaks to the people in difficult moments."

Church leaders plan to use these books in services and small groups to encourage Christians to stand firm in their faith. They also want to use Scripture to confront the *khat* drug epidemic among the youth.

In addition, Old Testament books will be used in outreach efforts since those who follow the majority religion are somewhat familiar with them.

## DEDICATION OF THE GIRYAMA B

hen the complete Giryama
Bible finally landed in
Kenya at the port of
Mombasa and eventually made its way
to Kilifi town, news spread very fast to
the entire Kilifi County.

Bishop Mmika Kenga of the Light of God church, who is more than 100 years old, thought that waiting until April for the dedication would be too long. Many others who had translated or participated in the translation work of the Giryama Bible were now very old and, like the biblical Simon, just wanted to hold the Giryama Bible before they could rest.

No other event in the history of the Giryama Church had ever brought together as many bishops as the preparation of the dedication of the Giryama Bible. The dedication brought together not only the clergy but also politicians and administrators.

A procession led by bishops and translators, both young and old, men and women adorned in Giryama traditional costumes carrying the Bibles in a Giryama traditional basket, commenced the day. Songs of praise and worship to God led by the Salvation Army band were sung through the procession. More than two thousand people gathered for the celebration.

Reverend Peter Munguti, National Director for Bible Translation and Literacy of Kenya (BTL), led the dedication ceremony assisted by the BTL Patron, Rev. Prof. Watson Omulokoli, and Bishop Lawrence Dena, a prominent church leader from the region.

Instead of giving a speech, the chief guest, His Excellency the Deputy President, preached, quoting many verses from the Bible. In Kenya, this is not the norm with politicians giving a

speech. He then asked all the bishops present to stand and reminded them of their role to the Giryama nation. He said, "I have traveled into most of this Giryama land, I have seen the people and I know the kind of spirits affecting them. Bishops you have some work to do. Some trust in chariots and some in weapons of war, but we trust in the name of the Lord. God is on our side. Let's trust in God."

By the end of the day, more than 900 copies were purchased. The Deputy President promised to pay for 1,000 copies to be distributed to the churches in the interior and another politician promised to pay for 500 copies.

God has been faithful to the Giryama nation. The project took many difficult years, but God has empowered the community to write their history and have his Word in the Giryama language.

# INCREASING YOUR KINGDOM IMPACT WITH A DONOR-ADVISED FUND

d and Donna, long-time donors to the work and ministry of Wycliffe Bible Translators, felt led by the Holy Spirit to "do something significant" beyond their normal ministry giving. However, their cash flow was tight and they weren't sure how to make it happen.

The couple decided to meet with a Wycliffe Foundation Gift Planning Advisor to discuss their situation. The Advisor encouraged them to look beyond their checkbook, and consider giving from their assets. He also recommended that they consider using a donor-advised fund (DAF), which would allow them to

make a single asset gift for the benefit of multiple ministries.

Ed and Donna owned several pieces of real estate, and they were considering selling one of them to make a charitable gift. But the thought of paying capital gains taxes on the sale gave them pause. Their Gift Planning Advisor explained that one benefit of a DAF was avoiding these capital gains taxes.

Ed and Donna agreed this would be an excellent asset to give through a Wycliffe Foundation donor-advised fund. Once the real estate was given to Wycliffe, it was sold, and the couple was able to make significant grants through the DAF to Wycliffe Bible Translators, and two other ministries. The resulting grants were many times greater than their annual cash gifts.

Reflecting on their gift, Donna said, "We never thought we could make gifts of this size and magnitude. By giving an asset through our donoradvised fund we were able to dramatically increase our impact for Great Commission work!"

# NORDSEARCH

Bible translation teams use local speakers to check their work — and the errors they find can be funny in retrospect.

During the last week of a translation workshop in Papua New Guinea, teams from the Aitape West translation project finished final checking of 1-2 Peter and 1-2 Thessalonians in nine languages. One of the difficult terms to translate was Peter's description of false teachers in 2 Peter 2:17 as "springs without water."



After discussion, one translator suggested they use the term raiyn iyn tokkoiynpaija takwama ropon epin kamlan, which means "water that boils through and up from a deep hole has dried." He explained how they have springs like this in his area that provide clean water for drinking. However, when the spring dries up it becomes a useless, stinking and overgrown hole in the ground.
